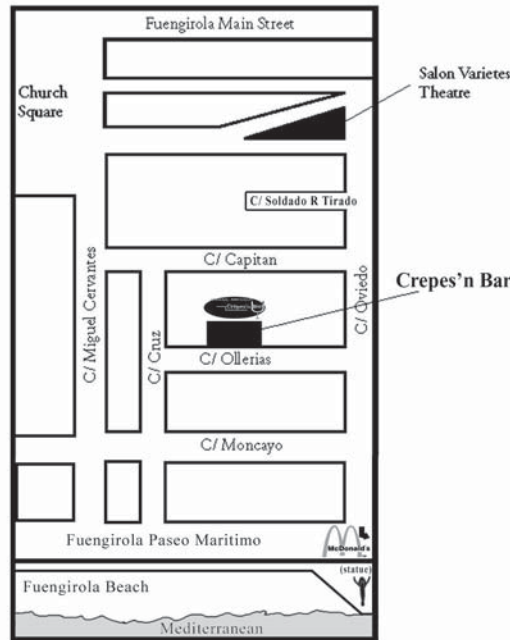

JILL BRIDGES (Celia)

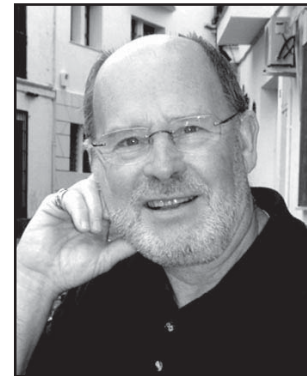
DAVID VINCENT (Chitto)
